

## **CITY OF MILTON-FREEWATER BUS SERVICE INFORMATION**

The City's bus provides a general-ridership, fixed-route, intercity service between the City of Milton-Freewater and College Place and Walla Walla, Washington, Monday through Friday, except for the holidays listed above. Click [here](#) to see the schedule and bus stop locations.

The fare for the bus is \$1 for each 1-way trip and may be paid in cash each time you enter the bus. But a bus pass may be purchased at City Hall for \$30. Each bus pass is good for an unlimited number of trips during a 30-day period from the date of purchase.

There are three bus systems our City bus coordinates with. Our bus has 6 connections daily with the Walla Walla Transfer Station on Rose Street in Walla Walla, Washington. This stop connects each patron to the Walla Walla Valley Transit System, a fixed-route system throughout the cities of Walla Walla and College Place, Washington.

The stop at the Walla Walla Transfer Station also connects patrons to the Grapeline bus system an intercity bus system that services Pasco, Washington and the Ben Franklin Transit system that services the Tri-city area.

A local bus stop at the Ace Hardware Store which connects patrons to the CTUIR (Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation) bus system, a service connecting to Walla Walla, Washington and also Weston, Athena, Mission and Pendleton, Oregon.
